

RISK OF EXPOSURE TO COVID-19

Assalaamu Alaikum Parents/Guardians,

We hope this letter reaches you in the best of faith and health.

Students who attended class during this session may be at risk of exposure to COVID-19 as they were potentially in contact with a positive confirmed case.

Testing and isolation is no longer mandatory for exposures in school-type settings. However, we kindly ask that you monitor your child for symptoms. If they are showing any symptoms, your child must stay at home and isolate and cannot attend class.

Symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, and shortness of breath, runny nose, loss of smell/taste, muscle/joint pains, diarrhoea, nausea /vomiting, extreme tiredness, unexplained chest pain or conjunctivitis (eye infection).

Students should also undertake a rapid antigen test (RAT). If it is positive, your child should isolate for seven (7) days as someone who has tested positive to COVID-19. If you cannot access a rapid antigen test, you visit your nearest testing clinic for a PCR test (nose and throat swab).
